

NZL World Cup Jumping League - Information for Organising Committees and Competitors

(Updated March 2021)

This information document should be read in conjunction with the FEI World Cup Jumping Rules & General regulations Note: FEI Jumping rules will prevail in any circumstance not covered in the current World Cup rules. All organising committees of World Cup classes must be affiliated to ESNZ.

Costs to be incurred by the organising committee

Please note this a summary of costs that the organising committee must cover, for further details please see the necessary sections throughout the document

- Prize Money (*minimum of \$4,000 as per FEI Rules*)
- FEI Permitted Treating Vet
- Officials travel, accommodation, and compensation
- \$600 + GST- Contribution to FEI costs funded by ESNZ, which are as follows:
 - FEI Organising Dues CHF 500 (Approx. \$800 NZD)
 - FEI World Cup Franchise Fee CHF 500 (Approx. \$800 NZD)
 - FEI Calendar Registration Fee CHF 500 (Approx. \$800 NZD)
 - FEI Vet Delegate (Trot up vet)

Fees to be collected by the organising committee and forwarded to ESNZ

Please incorporate this cost into your Entry Fee

- FEI Start Fee per horse \$10 NZD
- Equine & human anti-doping program (EADCMP) per horse \$50 NZD

Officials: Payment, Travel, and Accommodation Arrangements

The table below depicts the officials that are required to running a World Cup as per the FEI Requirements.

ESNZ will pay for flights or mileage for the officials written in green. **The remaining travel costs are the responsibility of the organising committee.**

All payments, accommodation, and meals are the responsibility of the organising committee.

- ESNZ will liaise with these officials regarding their travel arrangement to the show.
- The organising committee is responsible for picking up/dropping off officials from the airport and organising their accommodation.

It is highly recommended that the FEI Class Course Designer is the Ring 1 Course Designer for the entirety of the show.

If the show is running a FEI 1 Star Class as well as a World Cup Class, the FEI 1 Star Class Course Designer should be the Assistant Course Designer for the World Cup Course Designer.

It is highly recommended that the Organising Committee use all FEI officials for the entire show to maximise the investment in travel and accommodation.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- FEI Code of Conduct MUST be visible at all times during the show and if possible printed in show programmes. Code of Conduct is available from ESNZ Jumping or the FEI website.

Information needed from all Organising Committees 16 weeks prior to Event

- Entry fee (*Please specify if the entry includes EADCMP fee and FEI Start Fee*)
- Stabling Sizes (Must be 3m x 3m at a minimum)
- Total Prize money (*minimum of \$4,000*)
- Size & Footing of Competition arena
- Size & Footing of Practice Arena
- Organising committee address, email & phone number
- Show ground address and contact phone number
- Show Secretary Address & email address
- Show President &/or Show director with email address
- Show website if applicable
- Show Doctor/ Qualified medical services with address
- Farrier & email address

PRIZE MONEY

- A minimum of \$4000 prize money must be paid.
- Prize money for each FEI World Cup competition must be distributed to 12th place regardless of the number of starters (*Annex VI – CSI requirements – Prize Money distribution of the FEI Jumping Rules and Prize money chart (25%) in the Annexes to the FEI Schedule*)
- Should there not be 12 eligible place getters prize money must be redistributed to those eligible according to prize money chart of 25%

WC RULES Art 656 1.3, 656 2 - POINTS

- All World Cup rounds will allocate points according to the column used for 16 starters (WC Rules Art 656 2 – Scale of points) irrespective of the number of starters, (WC Rules Art 656 1.3)
- In the 2021/2022 World Cup season NZL have 7 rounds with 4 rounds to count for points: see FEI WC calendar below:

FEI World Cup – NEW ZEALAND LEAGUE 2021-2022 – 7 Qualifiers, 4 to count for overall standings

SECURITY (*Directive from the FEI Chairman of Jumping*)

- A separate area for parking will be considered a ‘restricted’ area for all World Cup horses on the day of the WC Competition.
- This area must be made available to competitors by the Organising Committee before or directly after the World Cup Trot up
- An FEI Steward must be assigned to the restricted area during the day of the World Cup competition.

WARM UP (*only for horses that have not started in a class prior to WC competition*)

- On the morning of the WC competition the Organising Committee must provide the WC horses and competitors the opportunity to ride in the main arena to acclimatize horses and to jump a maximum of 2 obstacles, 1 vertical and 1 spread. This session will only be available to WC horses that have **not** started in the main arena on the preceding day or days of the show.

- The Main Arena must be made available for 10 minutes prior to the first competition of scheduled classes on the day of the WC competition.
- An FEI Steward must be in attendance while WC horses are in arena.
- Competitors wishing to warm up in the main arena on the morning of the WC competition must advise the Organising Committee by 5pm the day prior to the WC competition. The Organising Committee must then advise competitors of the time the main arena will be available prior to the first competition of scheduled classes on the day of the WC Competition.

WC RULES Art 655 - COMPETITION FORMAT

□ As follows and should be included verbatim in all Schedules

Art. 273.3.3.2, 273.4.3, 273.2.2 Table A competition not against the clock (273.3.3.2) in the first round and against the clock in the second round. Athletes return for the second round in accordance with Art. 273.2.2. Athletes are classified according to their aggregate penalties over both rounds and the time incurred in the second round. Those not returning for the second round are placed according to penalties in the first round.

LEAGUE FINAL FORMULAS

Two round competition Art 273 3.3.2, 273 4.3, 273 2.2: *(When using this formula in the NZL Final League competition points and a half will be allocated)*

If an Organising Committee in conjunction with the ESNZ Jumping Board wishes to run the NZL World Cup League final as a Two Round Competition, **dispensation from the FEI is required prior to the event with confirmation of points to be allocated at points and a half.**

Starting order in the first round will be reverse order of the current World Cup League standings.

WC rules Art 656.4.6.2 - League Final over two competitions: *(When using this formula normal WC points will be allocated in both first and second competitions)*

First Competition

Art. 239 *Table C, over Table A course*

Starting order in the Table C competition is according to the reverse order of League Standings.

Second Competition:

Art 238.2.2 *Table A with one Jump off*

Starting order in the Table A competition will be according to the reverse order of results in the first League Final competition.

FEI World Cup™ Competition Speed and Height - (FEI WC Rules Art 655.5)

Each FEI World Cup™ Competition is run at a minimum speed of 350m/min. The height of the obstacles can be anything between 1.40 m and 1.60m maximum NB: no obstacle may exceed the height of 1.60m. For the avoidance of doubt, the provisions of the FEI Jumping rules Art 208.7 relating to a 3cm tolerance on the height of obstacles in competitions of 1.40m or more do not apply to the FEI World Cup competitions in which the schedule indicates a height of 1.60m. The spread should be proportionate to the height and not more than 2.00m. If there is a water jump it cannot be wider than 4.00m including the take-off element.

FEI APPROVED CUPS AND TIMERS

- Approved FEI safety cups must be used on all oxers and on both back elements of a triple bar, warm up arenas, and all other obstacles where possible.

CARO cups are available from ESNZ Jumping for all World Cup rounds.

- Electronic timing is compulsory and must be recorded to 1/100 of a second.
- Approved electronic timers must be used in all World Cup rounds. The following timer must be used at all NZL League rounds:

HORSE PARTICIPATION AND IDENTIFICATION

- All horses must be FEI registered for the current year and hold a valid FEI passport or approved National passport accompanied by an FEI Recognition Card. (***note: all FEI registrations expire 31st December each year regardless of when in the year they are processed***)
- All horses must have a current ESNZ Equine registration with an annual start for ESNZ Jumping
- **All FEI World Cup horses must wear an ID number as per FEI rule Article 282**, a three-digit number will be allocated to each horse for the World Cup season by ESNZ Jumping.
- All horses taking part in FEI World Cup Jumping must be at least 8 years old (*FEI Jumping Rules Art 254 1.1*)
- **WC rules - Art 653 9** - Any nominated horse in the FEI World Cup competition at an event may not compete in another competition on that day, neither before or after the World Cup competition.
- **WC rules Art 653 11** - Competitors may ride a maximum of 2 horses

An Athlete may ride more than one Horse in FEI World Cup competitions. In such cases, the horse going for FEI World Cup points has to be declared before the start of the competition, and the Athlete must ride this Horse first in both rounds. Once the competition has begun, an Athlete may not change their World Cup Horse. However, prior to the beginning of the competition an Athlete may change their FEI World Cup Horse only if his originally declared FEI World Cup Horse is scratched from the competition and the newly declared FEI World Cup Horse competes in the same position in the starting order as their originally declared FEI World Cup Horse.

- A draw will take place at approximately 5p.m on the day prior to the World Cup competition; one WC rider will be asked to attend the draw.
- If a CSI1* is held at a World Cup show, horses competing in the World Cup are unable to compete in the CSI1* (FEI Jumping Rules Annex VI CSI Requirements)

RIDER PARTICIPATION

- FEI Start Fee per horse \$10 NZD
- Equine & human anti-doping program (EADCMP) per horse \$50 NZD
- All competitors must be current financial Full Members of ESNZ.
- All competitors taking part in a FEI World Cup round must be FEI registered for the current year. ***(note: all FEI registrations expire 31st December each year regardless of when in the year they are processed)***
- Competitors may take part in FEI World Cup rounds in the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18 years (*FEI Jumping rules Art 255 3*). This ruling includes any Premier League that incorporates a World Cup competition. (*ESNZ Jumping Rules Annex 11 Premier League 2 – Qualifications.*)

Horse Inspection & Medication Control

- Horse inspection (Trot Up) will be conducted on a suitable surface. Handler's attire at the trot up should be neat and tidy. Horse's must be wearing their three-digit ID number at the trot up, assigned by ESNZ Jumping.
- Inspections are conducted by the FEI Veterinary delegate, President of the Ground Jury, Chief Steward, and jury members if available. Valid FEI horse passport or approved National passport accompanied by a FEI Recognition Card MUST be available for inspection.
- Boot & Bandage control must be carried out at World Cup events on all participating horses. FEI Jumping rules Art 244.
- At World Cup rounds there may be 'swabbing'. FEI passport MUST be available for FEI veterinary delegate.
- Prize money for any 'swabbed' horse will be withheld until results are returned.
